For many months now, I've been telling anyone who will listen about the lostness surrounding us in Henderson County. Some 70,000+ are unchurched or unsaved right here where we live. And, I've been telling folk that if each one of us, who are a part of the CBA, would share the Gospel with 7 people this year, we could cover the county with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Maybe I have been a little too enthusiastic. Maybe 7 people is asking a bit too much (although I'm not sure it really is). Maybe we need to start slow and build up . . . which brings me to what I

want to say about all this . . .

Many churches have taken the John 3:16 idea and have begun to incorporate it into a strategy for their church to use in reaching the people around them. The concept is simple. Most everyone knows John 3:16. It is a great verse to use in order to begin a Gospel conversation. And, it is a wonderful verse to utilize in telling your own story – then lead into using the same verse to witness the truth to a non-believer. I pray many more fellowships will take up this simple approach so that we may open our mouths and give a verbal testimony of Christ and His Gospel to the Nations.

We can link this approach with the emphasis that was initiated by Johnny Hunt and the

North American Mission Board. They are asking for all of us Southern Baptist to "Each One Reach One." This, too, is a simple concept. You begin to pray and ask God who that One person is the He would have you attempt to reach this year. You keep praying, especially praying that God would soften this person's heart to hear, and would give you an opportunity to share the Gospel with this person. If God desires to reach people with the Gospel (and He does!), and if we are praying for and searching for an opportunity to share the Gospel, then surely God will arrange for such to happen.

Think about the possibilities. If 14,000+ who are part of the CBA shared the Gospel with

14,000+ people this year, do you think the Holy Spirit could use that to bring at least some to a saving knowledge of the Savior? Would you be excited? Would the people of our churches get excited? Would it bring glory to Christ? Would we be being obedient?

I think the answer to all of those questions would be a resounding, "YES!"

So, what about it CBA? Can we commit to this together? I think we can. My prayer is that we WILL!

Lets get to it. Who's your ONE?

This year, let's pray . . . and Each 1 Reach ONE.
