WAS REMINDED recently of how my life makes an impact on those around me-how the actions I have taken have created lessons bigger than the words I have spoken. As my wife

and I sat with a young couple moving toward covenant marriage, we discussed the impact of the "family of origin" in each of our lives. We recognize things that we would like to emulate from our family experience, as well as things we would prefer to leave behind. Our actions have a lasting impact in the lives of those in our sphere of influence.

This is true of our spiritual lives as well. The words we say are vitally important, but the way we walk out our faith makes a lasting impression as well. Our relationship with Christ should be evident in all that we do. Every area

of my life should be submitted to the Lordship of Christ. Only then will my actions be properly motivated and make the kind of impact that God desires.

Paul reminds us of this truth in 1 Corinthians 10:31-11:1

So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God. Give no offense to Jews or to Greeks or to the church of God, just as I try to please everyone in everything I do, not seeking my own advantage, but that of many, that they may be saved. Be imitators of me, as I am of Christ.

People are watching what we do. Will our actions line up with the gospel that we say we believe? I realize that I must do all to the glory of God. I must not seek my own advantage- to glorify myself. Paul reminds us that we live a life of influence, and that influence should point people to Christ.

As we seek to fulfill the mission that God has called us to as an association, we must remember that it starts with us as individual followers of Christ. Strong believers make up strong churches that make up a strong association. We can accomplish great things when we stand firm in our faith as individuals, then stand strong together for the glory of God!

Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain. (1 Corinthians 15:58)

Follow me as I follow Christ. Let's be steadfast, immovable, and always abounding in the work of the Lord. Together... for His glory!




