Much could be discussed here, but may I share with you dependable one such us as North resource for Carolina Baptists? We are blessed to have the Biblical Recorder as our state Baptist Through newspaper. Recorder, we can learn of mission and ministry activities in our state and around the world. We can learn, from a Biblical perspective, how to encounter the tidal wave of secularism that surrounds us. The Recorder also affords us a unique platform for editorials guest columns discuss current issues of our day in a clear and fair way.

The problem is that only 1% of all NC Baptists read the

Recorder. Only 671 of our 4,300 churches subscribe to the Recorder. In my view, that is shortsighted. I understand that some stopped subscribing a few years ago because they were not happy with the direction of the paper. Others have ceased subscribing as a cost cutting measure. For the former, the direction of the paper is not longer a good excuse. For the latter, you are losing out on a tremendous investment opportunity. You cannot inform your people enough through newsletters, bulletins, emails, texts, PhoneTrees, or any other attempt to get the information into the hands of your people. I believe a subscription for every church member is a great investment in order to inform your people. After all, informed Baptist is ALWAYS a better Baptist. If cannot afford you subscription for everyone, at least consider a group plan. You can get 26 subscriptions a year for only \$135. would mean that, at least, all of your leadership would be much better informed.

For full disclosure. I am concluding my 4 year term as a member of the Board of Directors of the Biblical Recorder. However, I was a proponent of the paper long before I came on the board. Then, you will be contributing to writing the vision in order to make it plain. I believe that will be pleasing to God – the self-revealing one who makes sure His people are informed!




REGION 9 MISSIONS RALLY


